What will win us over in a choice of twin-fixed-bed vans: weight or looks? We find out

THE FIXED TWIN single bed layout needs little introduction. In the space of a couple of seasons, it has taken off and is now available in all sectors of the market. It's ostensibly a layout for couples who are happy to trade a fixed double for unimpeded access to the washroom, but there's more to this floor plan than meets the eye.

It's also good for families with children who are too tall for bunk beds or who don't want to share with a sibling. Mum and Dad can take the front double while the kids each get a rear single bed.

Naturally, compromises are made. With two fixed-length beds to accommodate, the designers had to be flexible with the lounge,

kitchen and end washroom. And on single-axle vans like these, every centimetre counts.

The tourers on test are premium products. Lunar's Clubman is one to aspire to, offering sophistication without the weight penalty. The revamped Coachman Pastiche

range was one of this season's surprises, offering stylish exteriors and high-quality interiors.

Prices are competitive, but the Clubman weighs significantly less. Will that win it for the Lunar or is the Coachman's showroom appeal worth the extra towing cost?

COACHMAN

Pastiche 565/4

Pitch and set-up

The Pastiche 565/4 is built on an Al-Ko chassis with AKS hitch stabiliser, buttonless handbrake and the ATC anti-snaking system. The front locker isn't all that tall, but accessibility is good. The hatch is secured by locks at either end.

Bolts for the front steadies are easily accessed from the sides; cuts in the rear panel simplify finding the other pair. Hook-up and water connections are on the offside, and the drain outlets are further back.

The one-piece entrance door is held open by a magnet rather than a catch. The control panel is above the door, and the mains consumer unit is under the offside seat.

Lounge

It's difficult to dislike this area. Swift Group may have pioneered the front sunroof, but Coachman's execution takes it to the next level – this is wider (1.37m) and frames the view outside better. Consequently, light floods in, showing off the pleasing fabrics and upholstery well.

The seats are firm and comfy, but more than four adults will feel squeezed. The centre chest has three drawers and an elegant slideout top. Other touches include speakers that face into the lounge, cassette blinds to all windows and LED corner spotlights. Two blown-air outlets and a mains socket complete the specification.

Kitchen

Space in this small galley has been used intelligently and equipment levels are high. The cooker has three gas burners, an electric hotplate, and a separate oven and grill. A digital-control Thetford fridge with separate freezer compartment sits under the sink, and a branded microwave is behind an overhead locker door.

As there's no dresser opposite the galley, worktop is limited. Lids to the cooker and the combined sink and drainer will help, and a dinner plate's width of worktop is to the right of the cooker.

An LED strip above the sink provides task lighting, and cooks will applaud the rooflight with its built-in extractor fan.

Washroom

Coachman washrooms seldom disappoint and this one is no exception. A domestic-style door, cord-operated light and a curtain add sophistication, while the deep basin and capacious vanity unit are very practical.

The sealed shower cubicle has a cubby for lotions and its own rooflight. The single-piece door is hinged to the left.

With 60cm between the basin and the entrance, there's enough space to dress, plus clothes hooks. A Thetford swivel toilet backs on to the offside wall, and the toilet roll holder is well within reach.

Beds

The nearside rear fixed bed measures a respectable 182.5cm x 73cm, the offside 187.5cm x 75cm, while their sprung mattresses provide firm support. An LED spotlight is above each headboard, and there's a TV mount and aerial point at the foot of the nearside bed. A mains socket on the nearside bed base, and a mirror on the wall above it, suggest this is the place to plug in a hairdryer. The gangway between the beds is 65cm.

In the lounge, adults will struggle to use the seat benches as single beds, but the double bed is 209cm long and made up in seconds by pulling a slatted frame across from the offside seat base.

Storage

The yawning spaces under the fixed beds can be loaded from the top or the front, and there's external access under the nearside bed. There is room for a mattress under the nearside lounge seat.

The lounge gets two overhead lockers on each side and corner cubbies flanking the sunroof. Six overhead lockers in the bedroom and a 59cm-wide wardrobe with two shelves underneath will easily hold a couple's holiday clothing. The washroom has seven cubbies, in addition to the vanity unit and a cupboard above the toilet.

Kitchen storage is restricted. There are only two lockers and a small cupboard under the sink.

LUNAR

Pitch and set-up

Al-Ko underpinnings are the order of the day for the Clubman, which has a buttonless handbrake, AKS hitch stabiliser and the ATC anti-snaking system. A single lock opens the spacious gas locker.

The front steady bolts are easily reached from the sides; those at the rear have no guide tubes and force you to crouch to find them.

Connections for the electric hook-up and water are on the offside, and the services drain is further back, just rear of the axle.

Just inside, to the left of the twopiece door, you'll find the master switches. Below these are the controls for the Alde heating and hot water. The mains consumer unit is on the offside seat bench.

Lounge

Light-toned cabinetwork and upholstery lend the living space an airy feel, which is just as well, because there isn't a lot of space.

The centre chest has two drawers, a cubby and a slide-out top for cups of tea. Four adults will fit around the folding-leaf table at mealtimes, but they'd have to be on quite familiar terms. The seats are well sprung and comfortable, though, and the gangway is 65cm.

The windows and large rooflight will keep the area bright during the day, with LED and ceiling lights for the evening. The thick curtains are practical, not just decorative.

Kitchen

With just under 1m of open space across the middle of the caravan, the SB's galley feels very roomy. It's well equipped, too, with a dual-fuel hob married to a separate oven and grill. A digital-control Thetford fridge sits under the sink, and a microwave oven perches at head height, to the left of a run of illuminated cupboards.

The circular sink is 25cm deep and takes a clip-on drainer; a sink cover and cooker lid add to the limited worktop. There's a bit of extra space on the dresser top opposite, but not with a TV there.

Task lighting comes courtesy of an LED strip under the overhead lockers, supported by a window on the caravan wall and a rooflight.

Washroom

The washroom uses its width well, but it's not very deep – a couple of centimetres of body length have been saved here. Stand at the basin, turn through 90° and you'll find movement restricted.

Home-from-home comforts include a domestic-style door, laundry basket, cord-operated light and central heating radiator. A fully lined shower cubicle takes up the nearside corner. Natural light is plentiful, thanks to a rooflight and side window.

On the debit side, there are no clothes hooks, and the toilet roll holder is to the right and above the toilet – not very user-friendly.

Beds

Both fixed beds are 1.86m long, so all but the tallest adults will get a good night's sleep here. The mattresses are firm, the headboards are easy on the eye and there's an LED spotlight over each.

Up front, each lounge seat measures 1.5m, long enough for younger children to use them as single beds. The double bed measures a substantial 2.11m long, but the intrusion of the centre chest robs it of width. It makes up using pull-out slats, which run on a track so they won't come adrift.

Storage

As you'd expect, the SB will happily accommodate plenty of kit under each fixed bed. These spaces can be loaded from inside or out.

Six overhead lockers look down on the lounge, one of which loses space to the radio/CD/MP3 player. The nearside seat bench has enough room to stow bedding.

Kitchen storage space is at a premium, because the microwave robs some overhead locker space. Further down, there's a cupboard with a cutlery drawer and two shelves, while the dresser opposite has two deep shelves.

The caravan's wardrobe is mounted at the end of the nearside bed and sits atop three shelves and a cubby. Extra space for clothes is available in two overhead lockers on each side of the bedroom.

Verdict

In a straightforward comparison of two aspirational tourers, it would be reasonable to expect that the lighter of the two, by a whopping 200kg, would take top honours, especially when it's £750 cheaper and has the desirable Alde wet central heating system.

But it's not as clear-cut as that. The vans on test play to the strengths of each brand. The Clubman's design tweaks for this season are accompanied by a year-on-year weight reduction of 45kg, reinforcing Lunar's credentials as the go-to brand for low weights.

The Pastiche 565/4, on the other hand, has a different appeal. Buyers prize the marque's bomb-proof build quality and comfortable interiors. Coachman caravans aren't known for their low weights; in fact, the average weight of the facelifted 2012


Pastiche range has increased by 0.5% on 2011 models.


The Coachman is heavier than the Lunar by some margin, and will require the likes of a small 4x4 to tow it. The higher towing costs won't suit all buyers, but if the Pastiche is used as a seasonal van,

And it's certainly geared up for this kind of application, with superpitch connections, external gas and power points and a blownair outlet to the awning.

We'd love to be sensible and favour the van that weighs less, and costs less to buy and tow, but in the metal the Coachman is a tourer you could fall in love with. If the fixed-twin-bed layout tops your shopping list and you want one of the best executions of it, you will have no regrets about investing in a Pastiche 565/4.





